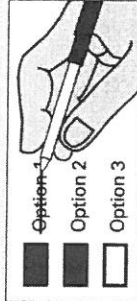
**How to vote**

Vote for one in each race. If you vote for more than one, no votes will be counted for that race.

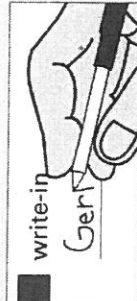
**If you make a mistake**

**INITIATIVE TO THE PEOPLE**

**INITIATIVE MEASURE NO. 1351**

Initiative Measure No. 1351 concerns K-12 education. This measure would direct the legislature to allocate funds to reduce class sizes and increase staffing support for students in all K-12 grades, with additional class-size reductions and staffing increases in high-poverty schools. **INITIATIVE MEASURE NO. 591**

Initiative Measure No. 591 concerns firearms. This measure would prohibit government agencies from confiscating guns or other firearms from citizens without due process, or from requiring background checks on firearm recipients unless a uniform national standard is required.
