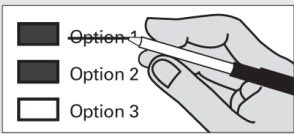
**How to vote**

Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection  
and Emergency Medical Services.

The Board of Lincoln County Fire  
Protection District No. 7 adopted  
Resolution No. 2022-02 concerning a  
proposition to maintain and adequately  
fund District operations.

This proposition authorizes the District  
to establish its 2022 property tax levy at  
\$1.00 per \$1,000.00 of assessed  
valuation (collected in 2023) and  
authorizes annual adjustments for the  
five succeeding years based on the  
greater of one percent or the 12-month  
West Region CPI-U reported in June of  
each levy year, subject to statutory  
limits. The maximum allowable levy in  
2027 (collected in 2028) shall serve as  
the base for subsequent levy  
limitations.
