Board Member Duties

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Must be a resident of that part of Lincoln County he/she is appointed to represent. As this is a voluntary position, candidate must be interested and willing to serve the community and attend 6 meetings a year, with an occasional possibility of emergency meetings or hearings.

BASIC FUNCTION: Develop general policy and guidelines to direct the program and actions of the Weed Board staff in maintaining compliance and coordination with state, federal, and other agencies and regulations involved.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED: Direct responsibility for and indirect supervision of the Weed Board Coordinator.

EXAMPLES OF PRINCIPLE DUTIES:

- 1. Develops policy and guidelines under which the Weed Board staff operates to improve the county noxious weed control program, including coordination with state and federal agencies, as well as bordering counties for maximizing control opportunities.
- 2. Hold board meetings to conduct business, keeping updated with important in-county situations, as well as state and federal issues involving noxious weed control, hold hearings, and informational meetings as needed.
- 3. Review and adopt an annual budget.
- **4.** Annually review and adopt a weed list.
- **5.** Review applications for the Coordinator position, conduct interviews, and select candidate to be hired; also, perform an annual performance review of the Coordinator.
- **6.** Citizens within your District, may contact you with noxious weed sightings or complaints, that you then pass report to the Weed Board office.
